In the past this has taken a couple qualifiers for some, but for others it has taken several year.s However nothing compares to the excitement of qualifying. The more work that has gone into the attempt the more satisfying the accomplishment. So don't get depressed and just give up - ask for help!

SEIB take all cheating very seriously and we believe that the rules of Search for a Star are very clear. If you are not eligible it is very unlikely that we will not hear about it and we WILL TAKE ACTION and will disqualify any competitor that has broken the rules.

SEIB SEARCH FOR A STAR HORSE OF THE YEAR SHOW QUALIFIERS

Show Hunters, Show Cobs including Maxi, Riding Horse and Hacks, Working Horse, Working Pony, Traditional Gypsy Cob (all colours)

Search for a Star is designed to give amateur riders and owners an opportunity to appear at the prestigious Horse of the Year Show and to identify top class horses and ponies which otherwise may not be given the opportunity to compete at this level.

Although only for amateurs the series is run by professionals and the standards imposed are identical to those applied to professionals. One fundamental difference is that at HOYS the judges will use radio microphones to give their thoughts and explain decisions. They will not publicly criticise riders or horses.

KEY DETAILS

Search For A Star Competition ("SFAS") is open to amateur riders only except the Open Ridden Veteran Class.. Eligible riders include those who have not ridden, exhibited or owned a horse that has competed in a showing class at Horse of the Year Show since 2012; who do not produce, ride or train horses or riders for the show ring for remuneration, and are not judges registered with any association or society.

SFAS is open to horses and ponies who have not qualified for Horse of the Year Show ("HOYS") before 1 March 2022. They may have qualified for Royal International Horse Show ("RIHS") before this date but may not have been placed in any class.

The horse or pony must never have been exhibited by a professional show rider or producer before competing at HOYS. Please read the rules for more details.

All times are approximate – competitors must declare 30 minutes before the stated start time of each class - see rules about declaration.

We will endeavour to run to time – further information will be available on the day from the secretary.

The SEIB Search for a Star Mountain and Moorland series 2022 will have one class incorporating both large and small breeds, (younger children will canter separately). The Championship will be held at Your Horse Live on 11th November 2022.

SEARCH FOR A STAR MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND

The Search for a Star Mountain and Moorland Championship 2022 is designed to give amateur riders and owners an opportunity to compete at this prestigious event. Your Horse Live welcomes over 24,500 visitors and the main arena has seating for just under 3,000.

This is a unique opportunity to compete for the title of SEIB Search for a Star Mountain and Moorland Champion 2022. So many ponies have gone to success after taking part in the Search for a Star experience. We will endeavour to give you help, advice and support throughout your Search for a Star journey.

Run by professionals and the standards imposed are identical to those applied to professionals. One fundamental difference is that at the Championship the judges will use radio microphones to give their thoughts and explain their decisions. Don't be worried they will not publicly criticise your pony.

All ponies exhibited in the SEIB Search for a Star M&M class must be registered in the main body of the Pure Bred M&M Stud Book of their respective breeds at the time of entry and entered in the name and ownership under which they are currently registered.

All ponies exhibited in the SEIB Search for a Star M&M classes are to be trimmed only within their Breed Society specification. Manes must not be plaited and tails not braided. No false hair or hair dyeing allowed. Ponies are restricted to the height limits laid down by their appropriate breed societies large breeds must not exceed 148cms, with the exception of Dales and Welsh Section D Cobs for which the respective Breed Society definition includes larger height ponies.

DALES Preferred height range 14hh - 14.2hh (142.2cm – 148cm) (Ponies above and below this range to be placed at the discretion of the judges)

FELL Not exceeding 14hh (142.2cm)

NEW FOREST Not exceeding 14.2hh (148cm)

SHETLAND Not exceeding 42 inches (107cm)

WELSH A Not exceeding 12hh (121.9 cm)

WELSH B Not exceeding 13.2hh (137.2 cm)

WELSH C Not exceeding 13.2hh (137.2 cm)

WELSH D Exceeding 13.2hh (137.2 cm) no upper height limit

All ponies must be aged 5 years old and over

QUICK OVERVIEW OF SOME OF THE RULES FOR MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND'S:

No stallions and no riders under 8 years of age on 1st January 2022. However, please read the rules and regulations carefully you will find them on www.seib.co.uk/competitions and follow the link to M & M's. You need to be aware that we are very strict with our policing of our amateur status as stated in our rules.



SEARCH FOR STAR RIDDEN OPEN VETERAN HORSE & VETERAN PONY

Open to any horse or pony 16 years of age or over with any rider 10 years of age or over. Horses and ponies will compete together and will be expected to canter together as a class, they are likely to be asked to extend. No lead reins. There are no amateur restrictions on this class.

AMATEUR IN-HAND

Including Amateur in-hand plaited horse (any type) plus hogged show cobs, Amateur in-hand plaited pony (any type), Amateur In-hand traditional and native types, Amateur in-hand mountain and moorlands, Amateur in-hand veteran horse and pony 16 years of age and over.

SEARCH FOR A STAR PONY CLUB RIDDEN CHAMPIONSHIP



SEIB Search for a Star have joined forces with the Pony Club to offer a Lead Rein and First Ridden Championship for children 10 and under. Plus an open class for the older children that will look for horses and ponies that are suitable for all round Pony Club activities, have good conformation, an excellent way of going and a fabulous temperament. there will be no jumping.

These classes are open to children and young people that meet the Search for a Star criteria and are members of the Pony Club. Classes are open to any type of horse or pony, that is athletic enough to be an all-rounder but correct enough to be a show horse.

There will be extra awards for the best riders.

Qualify for Horse of the Year Show

The SEIB Racehorse to Riding Horse Championship is a series for thoroughbreds that have raced in either Point to Point, Flat or National Hunt Racing.

The competition is open to amateurs and professionals.

The format of judging will be as for a riding horse class but the best of type will win.

Therefore, if you have a hunter, hack or riding horse that has raced you are eligible to compete and the best horse on the day will be the winner.

Horses must be over 4 years old and 148cms or over, riders must be 15 years old and over. The first two horses will go forward to Horse of the Year Show (except at Hartpury or Land Rover Burghley Horse Trials where only the first will qualify); if the first two horses have already qualified, at the judges discretion, horses down the line will be eligible to compete at the HOYS Championship.

Land Rover Burghley Horse Trials and NAF Five Star International Horse Trials at Hartpury College are kindly hosting a qualifier in the main arena. No late entries will be accepted for these venues. At both these venues competitor numbers are limited. Enter early to avoid disappointment

Riders may only compete on one horse at each qualifying venue and only the first will qualify for Horse of the Year Show.

Please see timetable for class details and declare at least 30 mins before scheduled time.

CLASS 1A

WORKING PONY

Qualify for Horse of the Year Show

122cms to under 148cms. Ponies 5 years and over. Riders 12 years or over on 1st January 2022. Riders will be asked to give a short show and jump two fences at 2ft and 2ft 3in. The required show will be published on the website so competitors will have time to practice! Adults and children may enter and ride ponies in this class as long as their weight and size is appropriate, decision of the judge is final on the suitability of horse and rider. Unsuitable combinations will be eliminated. Class judged on 50% conformation, temperament, type and manners and 50% performance. Judges will ensure that conformation and temperament will allow the pony to be a competent all round performer, capable of doing most work including jumping and dressage. Harmony of pony and rider will be taken into account. Jumping style and approach is important and the judges will not ride. The same bridle must be worn throughout and snaffle bridles will not be penalised, no gags and martingales are optional. 1st will qualify at Judge's discretion.

CLASS 1B

WORKING HORSE

Qualify for Horse of the Year Show

Horses 148cms and over. Horses 5 years and over. Riders 12 years or over on 1st January 2022. Riders will be asked to give a short show and jump two fences at 2ft 3in and 2ft 6in. The required show will be published on the website so competitors will have time to practice! Adults and children may enter and ride horses in this class. Riders must not be over-horsed and the decision of the judge is final on the suitability of the horse and rider. Unsuitable combinations will be eliminated. Judged on 50% conformation, temperament, type and manners and 50% performance. Judges will ensure that conformation and temperament allows the horse to be a competent all round performer, capable of doing most work including jumping and dressage. Harmony of horse and rider will be taken into account. Jumping style and approach is important. The judges will not ride. Snaffle bridles will not be penalised, but the same bridle must be worn throughout and, no gags and martingales optional. Tweed or show jackets. Rosettes to 6th place. 1st will qualify at Judge's discretion.

CLASS 2

SHOW HUNTERS

Qualify for Horse of the Year Show

Exceeding 153cms, 5 years and over. Riders 15 years or over on 1st January 2022. Class will not be divided into different weights. Tweed jacket. Rosettes to 6th place. 1st and 2nd qualify at judges discretion.

Entry fee £48, Late entry fee plus £15

CLASS 3

RIDING HORSE/HACK

Qualify for Horse of the Year Show

Hacks exceeding 148cms not exceeding 160cms, riding horse exceeding 148cms, 5 years or over. Riders 15 years or over on 1st January 2022. Riding horse - tweed jacket. Hack - show jacket. The best of type will win. Rosettes to 6th place. 1st and 2nd qualify at judges discretion. At HOYS, championship rosettes will be awarded to both a riding horse and a hack (subject to horses forward to Horse of the Year Show) and they will both qualify for the final championship at the judge's discretion.

CLASS 4

SHOW COBS & MAXI COBS EXCEEDING 148cms

Qualify for Horse of the Year Show

Show & maxi cobs, best of type will win. Maxi cobs should be true to type and all cobs should be hogged. Riders 15 years or over on the 1st January 2022 and horses 5 years or over. Tweed jacket. Rosettes to 6th place. 1st and 2nd qualify at judges discretion.

CLASS 5

SEIB RACEHORSE TO RIDING HORSE

Qualify for Horse of the Year Show

Horses 4 years of age and over, riders 15 years of age and over on 1st January 2022. 1st and 2nd will qualify except at Hartpury and Land Rover Burghley Horse Trials where only the 1st will qualify.

Entry fee £48, Late entry fee plus £15

CLASS 6

TRADITIONAL GYPSY COBS ALL COLOURS

Qualify for Horse of the Year Show

Horses 5 years or over. No stallions. Open to horses and ponies registered as a traditional gypsy cob within the TGCA stud book. Part-breds not eligible. Riders 12 years and over on January 1st 2022. Any queries about horse registration contact **TGCAheadoffice@gmail.com**. Owners and riders do not have to be a member of the TGCA but horses have to be registered in the TGCA traditional gypsy cob stud book.

Traditionals will not be ridden by the judge or the judge's representative, but will give a show. The traditional gypsy cob should be a strong, sturdy and powerful cob coupled with an abundance of luxuriant flowing mane, forelock, tail, and leg hair known as feather.

1st and 2nd will qualify at judge's discretion.

CLASS 7

SEIB SEARCH FOR A STAR MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND

Qualify for Your Horse Live

Ponies must meet the breed standard, be registered in the relevant stud book and riders must be 8 years of age on the date of the competition or over.

1st and 2nd placed will qualify at judges discretion.

Entry fee £35, Late entry fee plus £15

CLASS 8

SEIB SEARCH FOR A STAR OPEN RIDDEN VETERAN HORSE AND PONY

Qualify for Your Horse Live

Open to any horse or pony 16 years of age or over. Riders 10 years of age or over on the date of the competition. No restrictions other than age on horse, pony or rider. Will be asked to extend and must be able to canter together as one class. The horse or pony will not be ridden and the competitor will be expected to give a show. Horses may be ridden side saddle.

1st placed will qualify at judges discretion.

CLASS 9

SEIB SEARCH FOR A STAR TRADITIONAL PART-BRED GYPSY COB

Qualify for Your Horse Live

Horse or pony can be any colour or type as not limited to coloured horses. No stallions. Not ridden by the judge – horse and rider to give a show. Horses 5 years of age and over in year of competition. Riders over 12 years of age on 1st January 2022.

1st placed horse to qualify for Your Horse Live.

Wildcard for 1st placed to compete at Traditional of the Year (TOYS) hosted by the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association.

Entry fee £35, Late entry fee plus £15

CLASS 10

SEIB SEARCH FOR A STAR PONY CLUB RIDDEN LEADING REIN PONY



Only Open to members of the Pony Club aged 10 and under but over 5 on 1st January 2022.

Riders, owners and handlers must meet the SFAS amateur criteria. Pony must be 12.2hh or under and meet the Search for a Star Amateur criteria. Snaffle bridles only.

Pony must be over 4 years old.

Lead rein must be attached to the noseband and not the bit and the child should be able to rise to the trot. Judged on conformation, way of going and temperament to be able to take part in Pony Club activities with a young child, pony will not be stripped but will give a show. Lungeing will be allowed, if the venue permits, but the pony must only be ridden by the competitor. Handlers of the lead rein pony should be suitably dressed with a hat and suitable footwear, ponies to be plaited unless they are registered mountain and moorland, traditional or native types.

Horses and ponies that have been placed in the Pretty Polly Championships at RIHS are eligible to compete in the Pony Club Search for a Star Pony Club classes. 1st placed to qualify for Your Horse Live.

Special prize for best rider.

Rosettes for all, placed down to 6th.

CLASS 11

SEIB SEARCH FOR A STAR PONY CLUB RIDDEN FIRST RIDDEN TYPE



Only Open to members of the Pony Club aged 10 and under but over 5 on 1st January 2022.

Riders and owners must meet the SFAS amateur criteria. Pony must be 12.2hh or under and meet the Search for a Star Amateur criteria. Pony must be over 4 years old.

Must be ridden independently but will not be asked to canter as a class. Snaffle bridles only. Will be asked to give a show and canter can be included, ponies will be stripped for conformation. Lungeing will be allowed, if the venue permits, but the pony must only be ridden by the competitor. Ponies to be plaited unless they are registered mountain and moorland, native or traditional types.

Horses and ponies that have been placed in the Pretty Polly Championships at RIHS are eligible to compete in the Pony Club Search for a Star Pony Club classes.

1st to qualify for Your Horse Live.

Rosettes for all, placed down to 6th.

INTRODUCTION

The Search for a Star RDA Showing Championship is open to any rider associated to an RDA Group who can walk and trot independently. Entry is subject to the Groups approval for each horse and rider. Stewards will be on hand to explain what to do but all competitors will enter the arena together and line up. Riders will then be asked to give a short show that can include canter but this is not necessary, just a good display showing the best of the horse and rider. Competitors will not be asked to trot together.

Any type of horse is able to compete and the class will be judged 30% conformation, 30% turnout and 40% suitability, manners and way of going, so giving a good show within the horses capability will be the way to succeed.

After giving a show the horse and rider will be asked to come out of line and stand for the conformation judge to have a look at the animal.

If numbers of entries are high the class will be split into sections with the top competitors returning for a final judging.

Riders should be neatly turned out, clean and tidy but tack and saddlery suitable for the rider not the show ring will be encouraged.

WHAT TO WEAR

Here are some indications on what to wear, but don't worry you won't be penalised at the qualifiers for the wrong jacket although you are likely to be given advice for the future.

Don't go and spend lots of money on new clothes, it is amazing what you can borrow, but do make sure you have your own, correctly fitting hat and that it is up to current UK standards. All competitors must wear a hard hat with a safety harness and this is required in every class.

REMEMBER, GROOMS AND IN-HAND COMPETITORS SHOULD BE APPROPRIATELY DRESSED AND WEAR A HARD HAT.

HUNTERS/RIDING HORSES

Riders should wear tweed jacket with collar & tie, though a coloured stock is acceptable. Plain leather gloves & a show cane, with boots or half chaps. Breeches should be plain, preferably beige.

WORKING HORSE/PONY

As for hunters but the wrong colour jacket will not be penalised.

HACKS

Male riders wear as above, but lady riders may wear navy or black jackets. If you are unsure whether your horse is a hack or riding horse wear what you think is appropriate, the judges will give you some advice for the future.

COBS

As for hunters.

TRADITIONAL GYPSY COBS

Hacking/tweed show jacket, shirt and tie, gloves, breeches or jodhpurs, in one of the following colours; cream, beige, canary (white or dark coloured are not acceptable), hair net, show cane/whip (MUST NOT exceed 76cms/30inches in length), jodhpur boots for juniors and long black boots for adults or skull cap complying to the new hat rules.

RACEHORSES

The rider should wear the appropriate clothing for their type of horse for example, a hunter would wear tweed and a hack a show jacket but no competitor will be penalised for the wrong jacket.

GENERAL

Horses and ponies should be plaited except for cobs who should be hogged, except for traditional types and mountains and moorlands. Coloured browbands are acceptable for hack/riding horse. It is also considered correct dress for ADULT riders to wear spurs or dummy spurs, but this is your choice no riders under 15 years of age may wear spurs.

SIMPLE SNAFFLE, SIMPLE PELHAM OR SIMPLE DOUBLE BRIDLES, EXCESSIVE LEVER ACTION IS ACTIVELY DISCOURAGED

Working horse/pony riders should remember that their horse must remain in the same tack throughout the class.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

If you are lucky enough to qualify for one of the Championships, adult riders should wear white or cream stock, men may wear a red hunting coat with top boots if appropriate for their type of horse. It is amazing what you can borrow, please don't think you have to go out and purchase lots of new clothing for one championship.

PLEASE NOTE

Grooms and In-Hand competitors should be neat, appropriately turned out AND MUST wear a hard hat.
